ABOUT FREEDOM TRUST

Foundation for the Rehabilitation Education and Empowerment of the Disabled of Madras (Freedom Trust) was founded in the year 1997 to cater to the needs of the physically challenged in terms of their mobility and livelihood by Dr. Sunder, rehabilitation professional.

The main objective of the trust is to provide mobility aids like wheel chairs, tricycles and orthoses to the rural physically challenged. Over the years the foundation has distributed mobility aids and appliance to about **22,500** physically challenged and has conducted **500** rural camps.

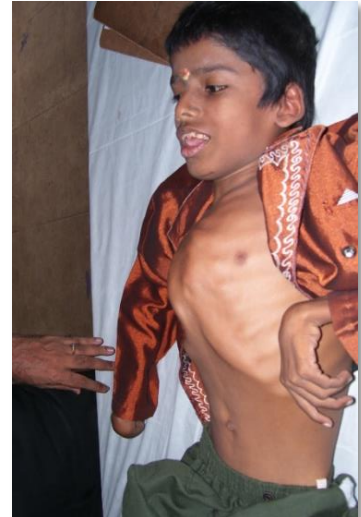
Under its talent promotion “Sishupunarjanmam” scheme over 40 exceptionally talented special children (visually impaired, hearing & speech impaired) have been given scholarships and training.

GRAM VIKALANG PUNARJANMAM

Persons with locomotor handicap need mobility aids to mainstream themselves in society. Some need wheelchairs, others need calipers, and some need artificial limbs. Those in rural areas cannot afford to come to the city or towns where qualified rehabilitation teams are situated; they neglect their handicap and later develop deformities which are difficult to correct, except by surgical means. Mobility is very important; to make a child go to school, to enable a student travel to college, and to make a worker go to office.

ORTHOSES AND MOBILITY AIDS

Orthoses, or calipers are custom made appliances given to paralyzed or weak limbs fit to the patients, enabling them to walk erect. Similarly, persons in rural areas have hardly any access to crutches, wheelchairs and tricycles which enable them to move from one place to another. Freedom Trust has been relentlessly working for the cause of such physically challenged persons and has helped them with mobility aids. We thus give mobility which is a fundamental need.

ASSESSMENT CAMPS

It is a process in which Dr.Sunder will assess each beneficiary; based on the physical condition, socio-economic background and condition of the existing appliances used by the beneficiary, suitable mobility aid is prescribed to the beneficiary. This process is usually assisted by a well-trained physiotherapist for exercise and physical therapies.



MEASUREMENT

Following the prescription of the appliances by the doctor, the beneficiary is moved to the orthotist-prosthetist section, where appropriate measurement for orthosis is taken by professionals. An orthosis is a mechanical device fitted to the body to maintain it in an anatomical or functional position. Each mobility aid is custom made to the beneficiaries and the process ensures fitment.

DISTRIBUTION CAMP

Distribution of the appliances; is a function in which the appliances are given away to the respective beneficiary upon providing them with proper fitment and training. Distribution usually involves the sponsor for the camp, team from the trust, the local organizer and the beneficiaries for the camp.

WALK INDIA



Mobile Workshop Sponsored by Rotary Club Chennai Mambalam

Physically handicapped persons form the lion's share of the nearly 10 per cent handicapped people throughout the world. A sizeable number of these are amputees. The numbers are variable, but there are statistics which estimate that 7 out of 1000 population are amputees and in addition, each year, an additional 25000 people lose their limbs in India due to diabetes, accidents and other hazards.

LIMB FITTING

In order to get back to mobility, the amputee needs to be fit with a customized limb or prosthesis. Application of the principles of prosthetic fitting is a very scientific process and involves the assessment by a rehabilitation team, measurement and fitment by a prosthetic engineer. Measurements need to be taken and the appliance is customized to the user, and cannot be mass produced. The limbs wear out depending on the usage and need to be replaced from time to time. Sometimes a person who has been using an artificial limb is unable to use it when his prosthesis wears out and becomes irreparable.

FREEDOM TRUST will conduct special camps only for limb fitting at various towns and villages all over India, and enable the amputees to walk with their newly fitted limbs. A van specially fitted with all equipment or materials to manufacture limbs and manned by a limb fitting team will tour the villages. Amputees from surrounding villages are brought to the venue. Qualified prosthetic technicians will take the measurements for the limbs, fabricate the socket and will be distributed to the beneficiaries free of cost. A qualified physiotherapist trains the amputees to take care of the limb, the stump and gives exercises for balance and gait [training component].





The project has been tremendously recognized and widely attracted the support of corporates and socially responsible groups in the year 2018 – 19, and ventured into Andhra Pradesh, Telengana and Maharashtra. This has been due to the efforts of FUEL A DREAM crowd funding site that raised money through the efforts of schools and was responsible for us to spread our wings to states all over the country. It is a partnership between Mission Samriddhi and Fuel a dream, which saw children of several schools participate and make over 900 amputees walk across the states of Karnataka, Maharashtra and AP/Telengana.

WARDHA PROSTHETIC WORKSHOP



The crowd funding with the students of Bombay Scottish School, Mahim resulted in huge success, the students raised funds to provide 550 prosthetic limbs in Vidarbha Region of Maharashtra. To facilitate the camping process, Freedom Trust for the first time in its history had setup a temporary prosthetic workshop in Wardha at Mission Samriddhi's facility. Wardha is one of the centrally located district in Vidarbha. A team of 4 prosthetic technicians headed by Senior Prosthetist was stationed in Wardha to manufacture the prostheses for the particular project. The team used Wardha as a base and camped in the surrounding districts such as Nagpur, Buldhana, Bandhara, Gondia, Chandrapur, Amravati and Yavatmal. The camps were supported by Mission Samriddhi's network across Maharashtra. The team travelled extensively across the region and organized camps in various towns and villages. Major reason for amputation was Gangrene caused by vascular problems due to excessive chewing of tobacco.

CASE STUDY I



Rubini, 15, had this very inspirational story to share. She lost her arm and leg as she came in contact with an electric wire in 2017 while she was playing. She mentioned that her mom was a beedi worker, and had 4 children. If not for her mom's tireless effort, she would not have been able to resume her life. She shared that people sometimes made fun of her or stared at her in public places, but she was used to it.

Earlier, Rubini was using a prosthesis that had a belt and it caused rashes and boils. The new one that she was going to obtain would not have a belt, and therefore she would be much at ease while using it. She also expressed that she was eager to lay her hands on her new limb and walk with it. She also expressed with tears in her eyes that her only objective was to make her mom proud and that was a reason she was going to work hard at her board exams. Rubini was from Vellore and she received her both lower and upper limb prostheses in a camp organized in Chennai. She was the school topper in her 10th board examination.

CASE STUDY I



This is Mr. Samrath Kumar an accountant from Vijaywada. The sole breadwinner of the family, he had to give up his job owing to his above knee amputation and is dependent financially on his brother. A year had passed since he had lost his limb and he had not acquired a prosthesis because feeding his family was higher on his priority list than mobility. This year for Samrath was very difficult, he had to deal with the trauma of losing his limb, get used to taking help to perform even menial tasks, re-learning how to walk. Losing his job due to his amputation and being dependent on his brother's kindness, the tension that arose for him and the rest of family because of the decision. The grief that his wife and offspring faced due to his condition. The inherent guilt that accompanied because all this was caused due to neglect of his diabetes.

In addition to all this, he had given his measurements to an organization in Vijaywada after his recovery from surgery but had not received the prosthetic limb. The man had become a shadow of his former self. Still a determined person, Samrath travelled all the way to Gudur from Vijaywada (350 kms), having read about Freedom Trust's camp there on WhatsApp.

When he had come to the assessment camp, he was still apprehensive, unsure if he would receive help. His mind was still weighed on by the cost of the journey, the time that all this had taken and the loss that he would incur if Freedom Trust did not deliver. Samrath could not give up hope, he needed a limb to get a job, to regain some semblance of what life was like before his amputation. The twenty-day wait was almost too much for him. When the call had come, asking him to come receive the limb, he was still wary.



Relief flooded him on the day of the distribution camp as he was being fitted with his prosthesis, he had felt like the weight of the world was lifted off his shoulders. Samrath had taken to the prosthesis and was able to walk without support almost immediately despite it being his first time using a prosthesis.

OUR PLANS FOR 2019- 2020

Sishupunarjanmam

We are planning to induct five more pearls to our existing list for scholarship and training. A talent hunt will be held in the month of July and fresh batch of pearls will be inducted in the month of Aug 2019.

Gram Vikalang Punarjanmam

- With support from United India Insurance Freedom Trust will be entering Madhya Pradesh to execute its Gram Vikalang Punarjanmam project to benefit 750 physically challenged persons.
- Hyundai Transys Lear Automotive (formerly Dymos Lear Automotive) has been joining hands with Freedom Trust in reaching out to the physically challenged over the last three years. This year too they will be sponsoring four camps spread across the year 2019.
- Lodge Ramprasad has come forward support the cause to a tune of four lakhs through which around 75 beneficiaries (suburbs of Chennai) will be receiving mobility aids
- One camp in Tirunelveli which will be supported by Sri. Hariharan (trustee), India Cements & Golden Jubilee Sankara Sankara School)

Walk India

- MISSION SAMRIDDHI - its extended wings massively support our Walk India Project in implementation at various levels. It gives the seed money for every on line crowd funding campaign. It has helped the trust in establishing a temporary workshop in Wardha to reach out to the amputees in Maharashtra & Madhya Pradesh regions.
- With support from Cavinkare Freedom Trust will be reaching out to amputees in Assam.
- Through Fuel A Dream's venture Freedom Trust will be doing camps in Karnataka in June / July.
- Dream Runners Trust continues its support for the fourth consecutive year to our Walk India project like Cavinkare & United India Insurance.
- With support from Savex Technologies Walk India camps will be held to benefit a minimum of around 300 amputees.

Research and development of a new limb: Freedom trust is in the process of developing a new prototype of limb which is cost effective and durable, and also user-friendly. A survey has commenced in order to find out the usability of our current limb, based on which the new project will be set up

Appliance bank - Several people suffer from temporary handicap and have used an appliance like a crutch during their rehabilitation, for temporary use. Freedom trust plans to set up a 'first of its kind' appliance bank, to tap unused appliances from the public and give to those who need them. This is very similar in concept to the Book Bank or Drug Bank.
